Robert le Frennd mason entered the house of Thomas Chapman at night and assaulted him, beating wounding and maltreating him; the same Robert was also wandering armed in Bristol; he is a common disturber of the peace.

Thomas Pypare, former servant of Adam de Blyddelowe and now servant of Hankyn atte Forde, feloniously stole a sheet and a carpet, price 40d, from Rose Bakare.

Iohannes Forster²²³ filius Iohannis Forster et Iohannes Dyket²²⁵ heyward de Auste vi et armis die Martis proximo post festum conuersionis sancti Pauli anno supradicto apud Olueston' per procuracionem Iohannis Crook' venerunt et ibidem insultum fecerunt Edwardo de [Seynt Lowe]²²⁶ persone ecclesie de Olueston' et ibidem circa domum ipsius Edwardi per diem et noctem iacerunt ita quod non audebat a domo sua exire quousque Thomas Fort et alii eum manuforte fuerunt deliberati.

John Tyhulle assaulted Richard Reede; he also resisted the constable who tried to arrest him.
