CHURCH PLATE IN THE ARCHDEACONRY OF CHELTENHAM

IN the course of Inspections in the Archdeaconry of Cheltenham, the compiler of this List of additions to Evans's *Church Plate of Gloucestershire* took the opportunity of making a careful survey of all the Church Plate, and in doing so found that many corrections in the return of 1906 were needed. The preface to the book shows that several persons undertook to prepare the returns for the use of Mr Evans. The task of weighing and measuring the plate required a high degree of care, and it is with no suggestion of criticism that the appendix of corrections, which forms the second part of this List, has been made in order that they may be of use to those interested in Church Plate.

The particulars of additions to the plate in the Archdeaconry since 1906 show that a quantity has been added, and it includes the plate of eight Churches some of which were not then in the Diocese of Gloucester.* It is hoped that the plate in the Archdeaconry of Gloucester may one day receive the same attention, and thus complete the value of the original work done by Mr Evans.
