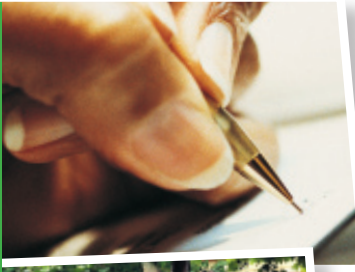


Write around Gloucestershire!

● Why?

● Who?

● What?

Whether it's a short story, poem, anecdote, play, essay, traditional tale, speech or article we want to read your thoughts on life in Gloucestershire in any format.

You might want to reminisce on local life before cars, research Gloucestershire's heroes and villains, tell us about your day out, imagine what Gloucestershire will be like in 3007, or prepare a speech for your district MP; with your own ideas!

The piece must have a title, be a maximum of 1000 words (no minimum length) and must relate to Gloucestershire. Run with your imagination and let your pen go wild!

● When?

Anywhere! At home, school, college, local shops, libraries, WI meeting, university, learning centre, railway station, bus stop, the park, canteen...

● How?

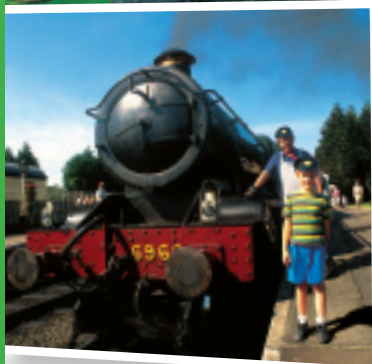

Entry conditions

- The winning entries will be those that best relate to the theme of Gloucestershire and offer an original or interesting take on this topic. Works written with particular inspiration, humour or understanding will be given extra merit.
- The maximum word limit is 1000 words per entry. There is no minimum word limit.
- Each entry must have a title.
- All submissions must be the work of the person submitting the material. This material should not have previously been published in any medium.
- All submissions must be from a home, work or study address in Gloucestershire. All submissions must be in English.
- Submissions must be legible to the judges. Material considered by the judges to be in any way discriminatory or offensive will not be considered.
- The judges' decision will be final.
- Entries cannot be withdrawn once they have been submitted. Entries cannot be resubmitted.
- Each entrant may only submit one piece of work.
- The organisers cannot enter into correspondence on this subject.
- Copyright will remain with the author. Gloucestershire 1000 reserves the right to arrange the first publication and broadcast of the successful works.
- Entrants may be expected to be involved in a small amount of publicity during, and immediately after, the competition.
